The table discuss three questions based on inputs from the day and with the index from Aalborg Municipality as the case to inspire the discussions. A moderator from London School of Economics or IFHP will be ready to guide and take keynotes.

The seating is free. You are welcome to use the law of the two feet and shift table if you want to participate at another table.

Question A: What does the index show

- How are you currently measuring these dimensions in your city
- What does this tool add to the process
- What information does it show that you are currently not collecting
- Are you currently tracking progress longitudinally

Question B: From measurement to action

- How can you use the tool to track the impact of your policies/ projects
- How are you currently tracking progress in your city and measuring the impact of your policies on social outcomes
- How can you use the tool to engage in best practice exchange with other municipalities
- How can you use the tool to engage in every day collaboration across administrative entities within the municipal body

Question C: How to benefit from the tool

- Is the tool duplicating some of your work
- How will you include the data collection in your work stream
- How can the tool be used in developing new cross-administrative everyday work streams
- How should we improve the tool further

What can we conclude from the preliminary measurements made with the IFHP Social Cities Index?

What are the appropriate actions that cities need to take to manage the risks and opportunities identified?

And what does it mean to our housing and planning practices?
